

2013 FRIDAY NIGHT WINDSURFING SERIES

St. Francis Yacht Club April 12 & 26, May 10 & 24, June 7 & 21, July 5 & 19, August 2, 16, & 30, September 13 & 20

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

The regatta shall be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS), including Appendix B - Windsurfing Competition Rules, except as any of these are altered by this Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions.

2. ENTRIES

Eligible boards shall complete registration online (www.stfyc.com) prior to racing.

3. COMMUNICATION WITH COMPETITORS

- **3.1** Official Notices will be posted on the Official Regatta Notice Board located in the hallway adjacent to the side (Regatta) entrance of StFYC.
- **3.2** Changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted by 1600 hours on the day they are to take effect.
- 3.3 Questions regarding the Sailing Instructions may be submitted in writing to the Race Committee. Questions and written responses will be posted on the Official Regatta Notice Board.

4. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- **4.1** Racing will be held on the following dates: 4/12, 4/26, 5/10, 5/24, 6/7, 6/21, 7/5, 7/19, 8/2, 8/16, 8/30, 9/13, 9/20.
- **4.2** The first Warning Signal each night is scheduled for 1730 hours.

5. RACING AREA

The intended racing area will be the San Francisco City Front.

6. COURSES

The Race Committee will announce the course to be sailed on the PA before the warning signal.

Course A: Start \rightarrow Anita Rock(p) \rightarrow X(s) \rightarrow Finish

Course B: Start \rightarrow Anita Rock(p) \rightarrow B(p) \rightarrow X(s) \rightarrow Finish

Course C: Start \rightarrow Anita Rock(p) \rightarrow A(s) \rightarrow B(p) \rightarrow X(s) \rightarrow Finish

Course D: Start \rightarrow Anita Rock(p) \rightarrow B(p) \rightarrow A(s) \rightarrow X(p) \rightarrow Finish

Course E: Start \rightarrow Anita Rock(p) \rightarrow A(p) \rightarrow X(s) \rightarrow Finish

*If any of the above marks are off station, they will be substituted with a round orange buoy.

7. THE START

- 7.1 The Starting Line is between the StFYC "A" (outer) and "B" (inner) buoys. If either of these buoys are off station, an orange inflatable buoy will be in its place.
- **7.2** Races will be started in accordance with RRS 26:

Signal	Flag and Sound	Minutes before the Start
Warning	Class flag up with one sound	5
Preparatory	Code flag P, I, Z, Z with I, or black flag up with one sou	nd 4
One Minute	Preparatory flag removed with one sound	1
Start	Class flag removed with one sound	0

7.3 A competitor shall not start later than four minutes after her starting signal. A board that starts later than four minutes after her starting signal will be scored DNS.

8. RECALLS

The Race Committee may hail the sail number(s) of the board(s) identified on the course side of the starting line after the starting signal by loud hailer. The failure of a hail, the failure of a board hearing the hail or the order of the hails shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

9. THE FINISH

The Finish Line is between the StFYC "A" (outer) and "B" (inner) buoys. If either of these buoys are off station, an orange inflatable buoy will be in its place.

10. TIME LIMIT FOR EACH RACE

The Time Limit for each race is 30 minutes. A competitor failing to finish within 15 minutes after the first competitor sails the course shall be scored "Did Not Finish (DNF)" by the Race Committee. This changes RRS 35.

11. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 11.1 Protests and requests for redress shall be written on standard US SAILING Protest Forms. Protest Forms are available at the StFYC Race Office, and shall be lodged with the Race Office within 60 minutes of the finish of the last board in the last race of the day. This time limit will be posted on the Official Notice Board.
- 11.2 The Protest Committee will attempt to hear protests upon completion of the next scheduled Friday night's races. The time and place of hearing will be emailed to all involved parties.
- 11.3 A request to reopen a hearing must be delivered to the Front Desk of StFYC within 30 minutes of the parties to the protest receiving the Jury's decision (oral or written). This changes RRS 66.

12. NIGHTLY SCORING

- **12.1** One race must be completed to constitute a series.
- **12.2** If five races or more are completed, a competitor may discard her worst score (per B8.2).
- **12.3** The Scoring System described in **Appendix B** will be used as modified below.

DNF (Did Not Finish) = Number of Starters + 1

DNS (Did Not Start) = Number of Starters + 1

DSQ (Disqualified) = Number of Starters + 2

RAF (Retired After Finish) = Number of Starters + 1

DNC (Did Not Compete) = Total Number of Series Registrants + 1

13. SEASON SCORING

- 13.1 Competitors must register and pay for the entire series by May 10, 2013 to be eligible for overall series scoring. Competitors registered for the Season Series shall serve one evening as a Race Committee volunteer to be eligible for overall series scoring. The limit for Race Committee is two people on a first call and/or e-mail basis.
- **13.2 Throw-outs -** There will be three throw-out evenings for the Season Series. One throw-out shall be used as a Race Committee volunteer.

14. DISPOSAL OF WASTE OR TRASH

No competitor shall discharge trash of any kind into the San Francisco Bay. Any competitor observed breaking this rule is subject to protest only by the Race Committee or Protest Committee. The penalty for a breach of this rule, which may include disqualification from a race, is at the discretion of the Protest Committee. This changes rules 60.1(a) and 64.1(a).

15. PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded at the end of series based on participation.
