SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta shall be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)*.
- 1.2 RRS 40 is changed as follows: competitors shall wear personal flotation devices while racing, except when below deck or briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment.
- 1.3 *RRS Appendix T, Section A, T1* shall apply as follows: the first two sentences of RRS 44.1 are changed to: A boat may take a one-turn penalty when she may have broken a rule of Part 2 or Rule 31 while racing. However, when she may have broken a rule of Part 2 while in the zone around a mark other than the starting mark, her penalty shall be a two-turns penalty.
- 1.4 One Design J-105: Fleet One rules will be in effect.
- 1.5 One Design J-111: Fleet Five rules will be in effect.
- 1.6 One Design J-120: Fleet five rules will be in effect.
- 1.7 For handicap divisions: If a boat fails to supply a rating certificate the race committee shall score that boat DSQ without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.
- 1.8 *RRS Appendix T Section B, POST RACE PENALTIES* applies.

2. COMMUNICATION WITH COMPETITORS

- 2.1 A competitors' meeting will be held at StFYC on Saturday, May 16th at 0930 hours.
- 2.2 Official notices will be posted on the official regatta notice board located in the hallway adjacent to the side (regatta) entrance of StFYC.
- 2.3 Changes to the sailing instructions will be posted by 1000 hours on the day they are to take effect, except any changes to sailing instruction 3, number and schedule of races, will be posted by 1900 hours on the day before they take effect.
- 2.4 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located on the StFYC race deck.
- 2.5 When signal flag AP is displayed from the race deck, the time for the warning signal will be made no earlier than 30 minutes after the lowering of the AP. This changes RRS race signals.
- 2.6 Questions regarding the sailing instructions may be submitted in writing to the race committee. Questions and written responses will be posted on the official regatta notice board.
- 2.7 Race committee communications will take place on VHF channel 69.

3. NUMBER & SCHEDULE OF RACES

For all classes, five races are scheduled in the series as follows:

5	Sunday, May 17 th	Immediately Following Race 4

4. RACING AREA

Races will be conducted on the San Francisco City Front.

5. COURSES & MARKS

- 5.1 The courses and marks are described in Attachment A – Official Description of Marks and Courses.
- 5.2 No later than the warning signal, a placard designating the course will be displayed from the signal boat.
- 5.3 ***For all courses except for M through P;*** No later than the warning signal, a flag designating the mark rounding

direction will be displayed from the signal boat. If a red flag is displayed, all marks except for mark 3g shall be rounded to port. If a green flag is displayed, all marks except for mark 3g shall be rounded to starboard. For courses **M through P** the rounding direction shall be per the rounding order in Attachment A.

5.4 In the event that both gate marks (3g) are not in place, the single mark 3g shall be rounded in the direction of the previous mark.

6. AREAS THAT ARE OBSTRUCTIONS

6.1 For safety reasons, each of the lines bounded by the following two points is an obstruction:

- (a) The northern end of the SF Marina entrance Wave Attenuator and the closest point ashore.
- (b) The southern end of the SF Marina entrance Wave Attenuator and the closest point ashore.
- (c) The "H" Beam piling and the closest point ashore. (located approx. 200 yards west of the St. Francis YC)
- (d) Anita Rock Light located approximately 0.30nm West of StFYC ("Anita Rock" Q 20ft 5M), and a yellow buoy marked "AR" or a temporary orange ball (located approximately 100 yards northwest of the Anita Rock Light).
- (e) Anita Rock Light located approximately 0.30nm West of StFYC ("Anita Rock" Q 20ft 5M), and the closest point ashore.
- (f) The yellow buoy marked "AR" or a temporary orange ball (located approximately 100 yards northwest of Anita Rock Light) and the closest point ashore.
- (g) The Green/Red Bell Buoy off the west end of Alcatraz Island and Alcatraz Island.

6.2 Boats are prohibited from sailing across any of these lines while racing.

7. THE START

7.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange and yellow striped flag on the starting line signal boat and a red inflatable cone or a staff displaying an orange and yellow striped flag on the pin boat.

7.2 A boat shall not start later than 4 minutes after her starting signal. A boat that starts later than 4 minutes after her starting signal shall be scored DNS. This changes RRS 35.

7.3 Class flags will be as follows:

Multihull	white flag with black letter "A"
ORR/PHRF	white flag with black letter "B"
J/105	white flag with black class insignia
J/111	white flag with black class insignia
J/120	white flag with black class insignia

7.4 The intended starting order for the first race of each day shall be as listed in 7.3.

7.5 Subsequent races may be started in any order.

8. RECALLS

The race committee may hail the sail number(s) of the boat(s) identified on the course side of the starting line at the starting signal. The failure of a hail, the failure of a boat hearing the hail or the order of the hails shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

9. THE FINISH

9.1 For courses with upwind finishes, the finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange and yellow striped flag on a race committee boat and an orange buoy located approximately 200 yards upwind of mark 1.

9.2 For courses with downwind finishes, the finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange and yellow striped flag on the signal boat and an orange buoy, opposite the starting line.

10. TIME LIMIT FOR EACH RACE

10.1 Boats failing to finish within 30 minutes after the first boat in her class sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF) without a hearing. This changes rules 35, A4 and A5.

10.2 The time limit for the first finisher in each race is 2 hours.

11. COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC, SAFETY

- 11.1** As stated in the RRS preamble to the Part 2 rules, when a boat sailing under these rules meets a vessel that is not, she shall comply with the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea (IRPCAS) or government right-of-way rules. This supplements, but does not replace the rules of Part 2.
- 11.2** If a commercial vessel has sounded five blasts, and/or the vessel or the Coast Guard identifies an offending boat, the race committee shall protest the boat, in which case the protest committee shall assume that the identified boat has impeded passage or violated the U.S. Inland Navigation Rules, and the identified boat shall have the burden of proving otherwise. In the case of a complaint by a Vessel Traffic or the Coast Guard, the protest time limit shall be extended up to two days after the conclusion of the regatta. This changes RRS 60.2(a) and 61.3.
- 11.3** A race committee boat may signal a boat to alter course to avoid impeding the passage of commercial vessels by making a sound signal (horn or whistle) and pointing Code Flag V at the boat. The signaled boat shall promptly comply with the signal unless compliance would create an unsafe condition. If a boat fails to comply with such a signal, the race committee shall protest the boat, in which case the protest committee shall assume that the course alteration would not have created an unsafe condition, and the protested boat shall have the burden of proving otherwise.
- 11.4** Boats may not take a penalty under rule 44 for breaking any part of this SI, and a resulting disqualification shall not be excludable under rule A2. The StFYC shall cooperate with and provide relevant information to the Coast Guard or other governmental authority regarding investigations of boats impeding ship traffic or violating U.S. Inland Navigation Rules (33 CFR 83).

12. PROTESTS & PENALTY FORMS

- 12.1** Protests and requests for redress may be written on standard US SAILING protest forms. Protest forms and after race scoring penalty forms are available at the St. Francis Yacht Club jury desk. Protests shall be lodged with a protest committee representative at the jury desk within 60 minutes after the race committee signal boat docks. Requests for redress shall be lodged by the end of the protest time limit, or two-hours after the incident, whichever is later. The protest/redress filing times will be posted on the official regatta notice board.
- 12.2** The time, place, and parties to all protest and redress hearing(s) will be posted on the official regatta notice board within 30 minutes after the close of filing time in 12.1 above. This shall serve as notification as per RRS 63.2.
- 12.3** A request to reopen a hearing on the last day of racing must be delivered to the Front Desk of the St. Francis Yacht Club within 60 minutes of the announcement of the protest committee's decision (oral or written). This changes RRS 66.

13. SCORING

- 13.1** One race must be completed to constitute a series.
- 13.2** Each boat's score will be the sum of her scores for all races. This changes RRS A2.
- 13.3** Boats sailing under ORR will be scored using Time on Time All Purpose.
- 13.4** Boats sailing under PHRF will be scored using Time on Time.

14. DISPOSAL OF WASTE OR TRASH

Boats observed breaking RRS 55 are subject to protest only by the race committee or protest committee. The penalty for a breach of this rule, which may include disqualification from a race, is at the discretion of the protest committee. Discarding elastic or fiber bands or ties when setting a sail is permitted. This changes RRS 55, 60.1(a) and 64.1.

Additional Notices

BERTHING & TRAILER STORAGE

- All yachts competing in the event may be moored free of charge at the StFYC guest docks one night prior to the beginning of racing and one night after racing concludes.

PRIZES

- Trophies will be awarded based upon class participation.

6	Yellow Can "M" .20NM North of Fort Mason Piers OR temporary orange ball
7	Red "2" Fl R 6s (West of Northern end of Treasure Island)
8	Red "4" Fl R 4s Horn, 1.0 NM East of Point Blunt
12	G "1" Fl G4s, Little Harding Rock
16	Yellow can "TB" (Tom Blackaller) 0.45nm East of Fort Point
17	Green/Red "HR" 1 Qk Fl R at Harding Rock
18	Green/Red "BR" Fl Bell at Blossom Rock
21	G "1" Fl G6s Approx. 0.65 nm NE of Alcatraz
A	Yellow Mark .25nm north of the StFYC Race Deck
