

## **SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

#### 1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2 RRS 40 is changed as follows: Competitors shall wear personal flotation devices while racing, except when below deck or briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment.
- **1.3** Appendix T will apply.
- **1.4** J/105 Fleet One rules will be in effect.
- 1.5 US Sailing prescriptions to RRS 60.3, 63.2, and 63.4 will not apply.

## 2 COMMUNICATION WITH COMPETITORS

- **2.1** A competitors' meeting will be held at StFYC on Saturday, May 13<sup>th</sup> at 0930 hours.
- 2.2 Official notices will be posted on the official regatta notice board located in the hallway adjacent to the side (Regatta) entrance of StFYC and may also be posted online at www.stfyc.com.
- 2.3 Changes to the sailing instructions will be posted by 1000 hours on the day they are to take effect, except any changes to sailing instruction 3, Schedule, will be posted by 1900 hours on the day before they take effect.
- **2.4** Signals made ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located on the StFYC Race Deck.
- 2.5 When signal flag AP is displayed from the Race Deck, the time for the warning signal will be made no earlier than 30 minutes after the lowering of the AP. This changes RRS Race Signals.
- **2.6** Questions regarding the sailing instructions may be submitted in writing to the race committee. Questions and written responses will be posted on the official regatta notice board.
- **2.7** Race committee communications will take place on VHF channel 69.

**3.2** The race committee will attempt to run as many races as possible.

## 4 RACING AREA

Races will be conducted on the San Francisco City Front.

## 5 COURSES & MARKS

- **5.1** The courses and marks are described in Attachment A Official Description of Marks and Courses.
- **5.2** No later than the warning signal, a placard designating the course will be displayed from the signal boat.
- 5.3 No later than the warning signal, a flag designating the mark rounding direction will be displayed from the signal boat. If a red flag is displayed, all marks except for marks 2g shall be rounded to port. If a green flag is displayed, all marks except for marks 2g shall be rounded to starboard.
- **5.4** Mark 2 will be a gate. In the event that the gate is not in place, the single leeward mark 2 shall be rounded in the same direction as the previous mark.
- 5.5 Mark 10 is an offset mark set off mark 1. In the event that mark 10 is not in place, mark 1 shall be rounded as designated by the red or green flag flown on the signal boat at the start.

## **6** AREAS THAT ARE OBSTRUCTIONS

- **6.1** For safety reasons, each of the lines bounded by the following two points is an obstruction:
  - (a) The northern end of the SF Marina entrance Wave Attenuator and the closest point ashore.
  - (b) The southern end of the SF Marina entrance Wave Attenuator and the closest point ashore.
  - (c) The "H" Beam piling and the closest point ashore. (located approx. 200 yards west of the St. Francis YC)

- (d) Anita Rock Light located approximately 0.30nm West of StFYC ("Anita Rock" Q 20ft 5M), and a yellow buoy marked "AR" or a temporary buoy in its place (located approximately 100 yards northwest of the Anita Rock Light).
- (e) Anita Rock Light located approximately 0.30nm West of StFYC ("Anita Rock" Q 20ft 5M), and the closest point ashore.
- (f) The yellow buoy marked "AR" or a temporary buoy in its place (located approximately 100 yards northwest of Anita Rock Light) and the closest point ashore.
- (g) The Green/Red Bell Buoy off the west end of Alcatraz Island and Alcatraz Island.
- **6.2** Boats are prohibited from crossing any of these lines while racing.

#### 7 THE START

- 7.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange and yellow striped flag on the starting line signal boat and an orange shape OR a staff displaying an orange and yellow striped flag on the pin boat.
- 7.2 A boat that starts later than 4 minutes after her starting signal shall be scored DNS. This changes RRS 35.
- **7.3** The class flag will be a black class insignia on a white rectangular background.

#### 8 RECALLS

The race committee may hail the sail number(s) of the boat(s) identified on the course side of the starting line at the starting signal. The failure of a hail, the failure of a boat hearing the hail or the order of the hails shall not be grounds for redress.

## 9 CHANGE OF COURSE AFTER THE START

To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line) and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.

#### 10 THE FINISH

The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange and yellow striped flag on the starting line signal boat and a white buoy, opposite the starting line.

#### 11 TIME LIMIT FOR EACH RACE

- **11.1** Boats failing to finish within 20 minutes after the first boat in her class sails the course and finishes will be scored Did Not Finish (DNF) without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.
- **11.2** The time limit for the first finisher in each race is 2 hours. This changes RRS 35, A4 and A5.

## 12 COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC, SAFETY

- **12.1** As stated in the RRS preamble to the Part 2 rules, when a boat sailing under these rules meets a vessel that is not, she shall comply with the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea (IRPCAS) or government right-of-way rules. This supplements, but does not replace the rules of Part 2.
- 12.2 If a commercial vessel has sounded five blasts, and/or the vessel or the Coast Guard identifies an offending boat, the race committee shall protest the boat, in which case the protest committee shall assume that the identified boat has impeded passage or violated the U.S. Inland Navigation Rules, and the identified boat shall have the burden of proving otherwise. In the case of a complaint by a Vessel Traffic or the Coast Guard, the protest time limit shall be extended up to two days after the conclusion of the regatta. This changes RRS 60.2(a) and 61.3.
- 12.3 A race committee boat may signal a boat to alter course to avoid impeding the passage of commercial vessels by making a sound signal (horn or whistle) and pointing Code Flag V at the boat. The signaled boat shall promptly comply with the signal unless compliance would create an unsafe condition. If a boat fails to comply with such a signal, the race committee shall protest the boat, in which case the protest committee shall assume that the course alteration would not have created an unsafe condition, and the protested boat shall have the burden of proving otherwise.
- **12.4** Boats may not take a penalty under rule 44 for breaking any part of this SI, and a resulting disqualification shall not be excludable under rule A2. The StFYC shall cooperate with and provide relevant information to the Coast Guard or other governmental authority regarding investigations of boats impeding ship traffic or violating U.S. Inland Navigation Rules (33 CFR 83).

#### 13 PROTESTS

- **13.1** Protest forms are available at the StFYC Jury Desk.
- **13.2** Protests and requests for redress shall be lodged with the representative at the Jury Desk within 60 minutes after the race committee signal boat docks. The protest filing times will be posted on the official regatta notice board.
- **13.3** The time, place, and parties to all protest and redress hearing(s) will be posted on the official regatta notice board within 30 minutes after the close of filing time in 13.2 above. This serves as notification as per rule 63.2.
- **13.4** A request to reopen a hearing on the last day of racing must be delivered to the StFYC Jury Desk within 60 minutes of the announcement of the protest committee's decision (oral or written). This changes RRS 66.

#### 14 SCORING

- **14.1** One race must be completed to constitute a series.
- **14.2** Each boat's score will be the sum of her scores for all races. This changes RRS A2.

## **BERTHING & TRAILER STORAGE**

• All yachts competing in the event may be moored free of charge at the StFYC guest docks one night prior to the beginning of racing and one night after racing concludes.


MARK	DESCRIPTION

2g	Two inflatable yellow cones set as a leeward gate
