

### THE 2021 RACE SEASON BY THE NUMBERS

Despite the late start to the season, 2021 was a very full season that placed a heavy demand on the race committee. Counting the on-going November events, **158 people** on the Race Committee team **volunteered over 1,000 volunteer/days** of service. We were on-site **96 days**, supporting **26 different regattas** or race series.

This season we started and recorded **658 races**! Can you guess which regatta had the most races? (Hint: it isn't the Rolex Big Boat. Answer below)

Of the **158 volunteers** who contributed their time, energy, and enthusiasm this season, **43** participated for the **first time**. Congratulations and welcome! Our new training program, RC University, was attended by **24** volunteers for an average of **four days** each.



These are extraordinary participation numbers for any yacht club, especially so as we slowly come out of a pandemic year. Congratulations and thanks to all!
